DURATION

The duration of the placements will be approximately 8 weeks - 12 weeks normally from July to September.

COSTS

Travel costs to the various locations will be borne by the company and, in remote locations, accommodation will be arranged by the sponsoring Division.

Remuneration will vary depending on location, but would be sufficient to cover basic living expenses and travel in line with local host country student arrangements.

PLACEMENTS OUTSIDE THE EUROPEAN UNION

Any placements (but particularly those in Asia Pacific, South Africa and North and South America) will be dependent on your having an up to date passport and our ability to arrange the required work permits for you.

Students wishing to apply for these positions will be asked to supply substantial additional information and supporting documentation, and may need to liaise with local embassies with regard to work permit and visa applications.

CLOSING DATE FOR APPLICATIONS

The latest that we can receive and process applications is **31st January 2006**.
